

Team and Individual Successes

- Girls in the Upper Sixth achieved an excellent set of A Level results – 89% of all subjects graded A* - B.
- For the third year running, KEHS celebrated record-breaking GCSE results.
- Girls achieved 82% grades at A* and 97% A*/A at GCSE.
- In the Senior Maths Challenge, there were 8 Gold, 15 Silver and 30 Bronze Awards. Two girls qualified for the BMOG Maths Olympiad for Girls, and six girls qualified for the Senior Kangaroo
- In the Intermediate Maths Challenge, there were 21 Gold, 55 Silver and 61 Bronze Awards as well as 11 qualifiers for the Grey Kangaroo and five for the Pink Kangaroo. Three girls qualified for the Cayley, three girls qualified for the Hamilton and two qualified for the Maclaurin.
- In the Junior Maths Challenge, there were 31 Gold, 33 Silver and 47 Bronze Awards. One girl qualified for the Junior Maths Olympiad and 11 qualified for the Junior Kangaroo.
- One girl was awarded a Distinction and two girls were awarded a Merit in the Intermediate Mathematical Olympiad and Kangaroo.
- A KEHS team of four Lower Fifth girls won the Extreme Physics Competition.
- One girl in the Upper Fourth won a poster competition by Cogent Skills to ‘help parents get science career savvy’.
- One girl in the Upper Fourth achieved the runner up prize in the national Epic Era History Film Competition for her film on Suffragette, Emily Davison.
- In the British Physics Olympiad AS Challenge, KEHS girls achieved 1 Gold, 6 Silver and 4 Bronze Awards.
- In the British Physics Olympiad GCSE Challenge, KEHS girls achieved 1 Gold, 2 Silver, 5 Bronze Awards and 4 commendations.
- KEHS girls achieved 80% A*-A in GCSE Astronomy.
- In the Chemistry Olympiad, there were 5 Silver and 3 Bronze awards.
- In the Biology Olympiad, there were 1 Silver and 2 Bronze awards.
- One girl was awarded Silver and six girls were awarded Bronze in the Linguistics Olympiad.
- One girl in the Lower Fifth won second place and another was highly commended in the Uncover Copper Poster Competition, exploring the use of copper in renewable energy and transport.



- One girl in the Lower Fourth qualified to compete in the Northern Gigafinal for Chess in the Under 12-13 category.
- One girl in the Lower Fifth was awarded first prize in the Ettlingen International Piano Competition in the '15 and under' category.
- One girl in the Upper Sixth was named as Head Chorister at St Philip's Cathedral for 2016.
- One girl in the Thirds was awarded the ABRSM Beryl Chempin Prize for Grade 8 Piano for the year ending September 2016.
- One girl in the Upper Fourth was offered a place in the National Youth String Orchestra following auditions in London.
- In the Birmingham Music Festival, one girl won first prize in the Open Bach, Handel and Scarlatti class, as well as the 11-13 years class for piano. One girl won the Grade 8 class for piano.
- One girl in the Thirds won the 'Close Up' Art competition and had her work exhibited at the Barber Institute.
- KEHS Art Department took part in a sketching project as part of the judging ceremony at Lapworth Museum of Geology, which was shortlisted for the prestigious Art Fund Museum of the Year Award.
- One girl in the Lower Fifth was offered a place with the National Youth Ballet of Great Britain.
- In the Dudley Festival of Music, Dance and Drama, one girl won first prize in the Verse Speaking 13-14 years category of the Drama competition.
- In the Northfield Festival of Music and Speech, one girl was awarded the Hazel Winch Trophy for Violin in the 12-13 years category. One girl came first in four vocal categories as well as taking first prize for Grade 7 Piano.
- Eight KEHS girls achieved Distinctions in their ABRSM music exams.
- In the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, there were 7 Gold awards, 16 Silver awards and 42 Bronze awards.
- The commission on Religious Education visited KEHS Religious Studies Department as part of its review of the curriculum which involved visiting schools known to provide 'outstanding' Religious Education.



Sporting Success

- In Hockey, the U16 and U15 teams were both named county champions. The U14 and U16 teams both competed in regional finals. The U13 team won the Birmingham Schools Competition and competed in the national Independent Schools Hockey Cup, making it through to the Quarter Finals.



- In Netball, the U12 A-team, U14 and U15 teams won their county tournaments. The U14, U16, U18 and U19 teams competed in the Regional Finals, with the U14 team qualifying to represent the West Midlands at the National Finals.
- One girl was selected for the London Wasps Superleague Netball Squad and another was selected for their U17 Development Squad.
- One girl in the Thirds was selected to play tennis for her county (Durham and Cleveland).
- One girl was selected to play for the U16 Midlands Water Polo team in Division One of the Swim England Inter Regional Championships 2017.
- In the Birmingham Schools Games, the Upper Fourth team won their relay in rowing. In the individual competitions, one girl in the Upper Fourth took first place. In badminton, the KEHS U14 team finished in first place, qualifying to compete in the regional competition.
- At the Warwick 50s, one girl won the individual butterfly event and another won the individual breaststroke event in swimming.
- At the Junior Splash Lifesaving Competition, for the third year running, KEHS won the Junior category.
- Our U14 Gymnastics team won the Birmingham Schools Gymnastics Competition and one girl won the individual competition for the U14 category.
- One girl won the Year 8-9 category and another won the Year 10-11 category in the cross-country running regional heats. Four girls qualified to represent South Birmingham.

Serving the Community

- The school raised over £5880 for local and national charities and over £2000 in the annual school fête.
- Over £300 was raised in aid of Book Aid on World Book Day.
- One girl organised a Charity Showcase in aid of Birmingham Children's Hospital, raising £1300.
