UNIFORM 2025 – 2026

Girls should dress appropriately and smartly whilst at school, travelling to and from school and on the games field. Wearing the KEHS uniform with pride is part of a girl's commitment to the community and is a sign of respect for and loyalty to the school. Uniform should be named, in good repair, for example tights should not be laddered and shoes should be polished.

Regulation uniform is only available from the above designated suppliers.		
Blazer	Special KEHS blazer, to be worn travelling to and from school, as well as during the school day. In adverse weather conditions, girls may wear a coat of their choosing over the top of their blazer, e.g. a waterproof anorak.	
Scarves	Any coloured scarf may be worn as outdoor clothing with the school blazer.	
Jumpers	KEHS green jumper in 3rd -U4th (Years 7-9). KEHS black jumper in L5th and U5th (Years 10 & 11).	

Skirts	A choice of two styles of skirt. These should be knee length and should not be rolled up. Only regulation skirts bearing the white Tudor rose emblem may be worn.
Trousers	Only black, regulation trousers bearing the white Tudor rose emblem may be worn.
Blouses	Any white revere (open neck) blouse or green KEHS (Trutex brand) open neck blouse, long or short sleeved. No t-shirt should be visible at the neck. All incoming Thirds should wear a white blouse (any brand). Pupils in other year groups may wear either a white blouse or green (Trutex) blouse.
Footwear	Shoes or ankle boots should be formal, black, and polishable (made from leather or imitation leather, but not patent). Canvas pumps, Converse style trainers and sports trainers must not be worn. If there are extenuating medical circumstances requiring specialist footwear, please supply a signed note from a parent/ carer.
Socks/ Tights	Black socks, ankle or knee length, or black tights. Either tights or socks should be worn.

PE kit	<p><u>All girls must have:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a black regulation games skort or any plain black shorts. a school sports shirt. a school hooded sweatshirt. a pair of school hockey socks. shin pads which cover the lower leg. a pair of <u>plain</u> black joggers (must not have any stripes or motifs). a pair of <u>trainers</u>. a plain one-piece swimming costume and swimming cap of any colour. a sports bag to keep kit in. <p>for girls who wear religious bangles in PE lessons, sweat wrist bands in any colour, for example:</p>  <p>The following items are <u>recommended but not compulsory:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a pair of multi-purpose all-weather shoes with grip suitable for use on AstroTurf, for example:
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a school black skin base layer that can be worn in cold weather.
 a gum shield for hockey (you may order a gum shield through your dentist or any sports shop).

Embroidered initials on PE kit are optional.

Girls should not wear PE kit in school unless they have either:

- a practice before school and then a PE lesson before recess.
- a PE lesson in the afternoon followed by an after-school club or match.
- special permission from a teacher.

Good hygiene means that kit which has been worn for physical exercise is unsuitable for wear in classrooms.

Hair	Hair adornments should be simple and in either green, white or black.
Jewellery	Girls are not allowed to wear any jewellery to school other than one small stud earring in each ear. Each stud should measure no more than 0.5 cm and be of either plain gold or silver colour. No hoop earrings or other piercings are allowed, including nose studs. Any items of jewellery which do not meet these criteria will be confiscated and held securely at Reception ready for collection by a parent.
Make-up and nail varnish	Make-up is not considered necessary with school uniform but if it is worn it should be of a discreet nature. Girls will be asked to remove unsuitable make-up. Coloured or gel nail varnish may not be worn.
Lanyards and badges	Lanyards must be KEHS branded (these will be issued to students when they join the school). Only school issued badges may be worn in school and on school trips.
Optional	White lab coats are worn for some science lessons. These can be borrowed from school or girls can bring their own.
