Curriculum

At KEHS Sixth Form, academic life is vibrant, challenging and full of possibilities. A small number of A Level subjects are taught jointly across KEHS and KES, creating a dynamic, co-educational environment. This collaboration extends beyond the classroom, with co-curricular music and drama activities also run jointly with KES.

Academic life here is about more than just lessons – it is about discovering your potential, building lasting friendships and preparing for an exciting future.





KEHS enrichment experience


Our wider curriculum is designed to equip you with the essential skills you will need for life – broadening your perspective and building your cultural, digital and financial literacy, as well as promoting healthy living and effective learning habits.

You will benefit from dedicated study spaces created exclusively for Sixth Formers, giving you the freedom and independence to manage your own learning. Our enrichment curriculum offers modules in PSHE, Cultural Capital and Theory of Knowledge, encouraging you to explore different perspectives, develop substantiated judgements and express yourself creatively.

Every week, you will take part in PE, supporting your physical and mental wellbeing.

For those who want to go further, the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a fantastic opportunity to dive deeply into a topic you are passionate about. The EPQ is highly regarded by universities, many of which see it as excellent preparation for undergraduate study because it develops independent research, extended writing and critical thinking skills. And when it comes to your future, you will receive personalised guidance every step of the way. From expert support with Oxbridge, medicine and related courses, including plentiful super-curricular opportunities, to applications to study abroad and tailored advice for every university pathway, we are here to help you achieve your ambitions.

Co-curricular life

Life in the Sixth Form at King Edward VI High School for Girls is busy, exciting, and full of opportunities to get involved. On Friday afternoons, the school transforms for our Sixth Formers. Through "Friday blocks", you will have the opportunity to develop your skills and experience in a wide variety of areas, including first aid, Pilates, food studies, debating or lifesaving, join Stage Crew to work behind the scenes on our show-stopping productions, or become part of the editorial and design team for our pupil-led annual publication *Phoenix*, to name just some of the activities on offer.

Leadership is a thread that will run throughout your Sixth Form experience, with plentiful opportunities to lead elements of the school's Care.Do.Give. programme, deliver outreach partnership activities with local primary schools, join the Sixth Form Committee, become a House Captain, or a Lower School Prefect and represent the school at events such as open evenings.

You will also have the chance to travel – locally, nationally and internationally – on trips that bring your learning to life and help you explore the world beyond the classroom.

If you love music, you will have the opportunity to be a part of something extraordinary. With professional-standard facilities in the Ruddock Performing Arts Centre, you can perform in orchestras, choirs and ensembles, with regular concerts at the Ruddock Hall, Birmingham Symphony Hall and the University of Birmingham. Soloists can also shine in our Instrumental Evenings, Performers' Platforms and Lunchtime Recitals.

Drama is another strength. The Senior Production brings together up to 100 pupils from KEHS and KES for a fully staged show – from the enchanting classic A Midsummer Night's Dream with a modern twist to cult musical Little Shop of Horrors and vampire thriller Let the Right One In.

If sport is your passion, you are in the right place. Recognised as one of the top 30 sporting schools in England (School Sport Magazine, 2024) and named one of the UK's top 20 all-girls school for cricket by *The Cricketer*, KEHS offers a huge range of sports. Whether you are competing at a high level or just playing for fun, you will be coached by professionals, including Olympic and international athletes.



Results and destinations

A Sixth Form built on success

Our A level results consistently set the standard for academic excellence and ambition. In 2025:

43% of grades were A*
79% of grades were A/A*
95% of grades were A*-B

Among the 89 pupils in the Class of 2025:

21% achieved three or more A*s

15% achieved straight A*s

23 pupils took four or more A Levels, reflecting the intellectual curiosity that defines Sixth Form life at KEHS


